Easter has come and gone, but those plastic eggs remain. Now

that your little ones have eaten all the goodies that where hidden within, repurpose them into a social-emotional skills building activity. Using a Sharpie (or other permanent marker) draw eyes on one half of the egg and a mouth on the other half. Draw a variety of emotions – check out the emojis on your phone for inspiration – and let the kids mix and match the tops and bottoms. Discuss the emotions that are created and what might make them feel that way. Children who better understand emotions have more control over them.

### Join us for one of two special Make & Take sessions!



Is it a *Solid* or a *Liquid*?

Make this awesome goop at home and see for yourselves! You only need two ingredients for excellent sensory play for ALL ages! Oobleck is a non-Newtonian fluid, it acts like a liquid when being poured, but like a solid when a force is being applied to it.

 Mix 2 parts cornstarch with 1 part water. Stir until combined well, add more water if needed.
 Optional: Add food coloring to the mix

The mixture looks like a liquid but feels like a solid. It can be rolled into a ball, yet it melts when touched. Have fun using different tools to explore your oobleck. Applying pressure to your oobleck increases it's viscosity (thickness). A quick tap on the surface will make it feel hard because it forces the cornstarch particles together. But dip your fingers in slowly and see what happens—your fingers slide in as easily as through water. Moving slowly gives the cornstarch particles time to move out of the way.

\* Add a literacy component with a reading of Dr. Seuss's Bartholomew and the Oobleck!
